Message from the President

Glad to see so many of you at the general meeting on Thursday August 19. We all enjoyed pizza and a chance to learn about mounted shooting. Great job by Andrea Burke, Nick Kay and Ara Lavelle. Thank you so much for a very informative program.

A lot has been going on with the city. The council meetings have gone very late as they consider all the issues that the city is dealing with. There are many issues but the biggest one is the project proposed for Third and Hamner. It would be very high density housing with either 320 units and a hotel or 396 units with no hotel. Either way there would be a food court on Hamner. There is a housing overlay on that property so the usage is not an issue. The number of units, the height of the buildings, who owns Third Street in that area, how clean the property is and of course traffic are all huge concerns. Also the residents on Paddock Lane that back up to this proposed project have big concerns. The council is having a special meeting on Tuesday September 7 to deal solely with this project. You can come to the meeting or watch it online. You can voice your concerns by email or in person at the meeting.

At the last council meeting there was a presentation by the agency that is overseeing the cleanup of the Wiley property. When Wiley owned the property there was a lot of things dumped on the site including rocket fuel as well as other chemicals. They estimate about 30 more years to get the property clean and even after all of that they say there should be no housing or a hotel. Only industrial and commercial usage. Keep watching as there is still a lot that can happen with that property.

Our city council is working very hard to protect our lifestyle in the face of more and more state mandates about what we must do with our property. Having additional units on our properties diminishes the chances that there will be animal keeping on our properties or even other agriculture projects such as big gardens. One possible way is to create an historical equestrian overlay on all the non-commercial properties. Come to the Town Hall meeting on Monday August 30 to learn more about this concept. The meeting is at 6:30 at Nellie Weaver Hall.

Another issue is the coyote problem in the area of Pacer Park. Animal control is working with the

residents to help them with the problem. Please do not leave any food out that they might eat and make sure your dogs and cats are in the house.

You may have noticed that a number of streets have been repaved and that there is more white trail fence and other city facility upgrades. This is all because of Measure R funds being available for these projects.

Short term rentals are becoming more common and in some cases are a problem. Short term rentals are those places rented for less than a month and usually only a few days. You may know them as Air BNB's. The planning commission voted to ban them from Norco and the city council upheld that decision.

As we are able to have more events as well as our meetings I hope more of you will join us. Our next meeting will be at the American Legion on Thursday September 16 at 7 pm.

Thank you **Ted Hoffman** and all of the Day of the Cowboy committee for putting on this event.



The City continues to replace the trail fencing and this year has budgeted about \$500,000 for that purpose. You should see two new trails installed this year (River Road and River Drive). These new trails have been approved by the City Council. The City has also extended the contract for trail maintenance for another year. It is my hope that they might extend the contract in the future to include the backyard trails.
