JANUARY GENERAL MEETING SPEAKER, JUSTIN ROWAN

Our speaker in January was our police chief, Lt. Justin Rowan. Warning to all of you, there is one additional traffic officer now and there will be another traffic officer added this coming summer so watch your speed. Speeding is the number one complaint to the sheriff's department so they have reorganized the department to add more resources for traffic and the City is looking at budgeting for the traffic officer that will potentially be added this coming summer. Not a big surprise, 75% of the traffic citations go to non-Norco residents. Hopefully, we will become known as the city that gives you a ticket if you speed here.

Along with the traffic issue is the problem of children driving golf carts on the streets and horse trails. Parents need to understand that letting your child under the age of 16 drive an ATV or golf cart on the streets and trails is the same as giving them the keys to your car. I hope we can get this situation corrected for everyone's safety.

Also, he talked some about the homeless project that the City has entered into with our surrounding cities. A number of the homeless people have been taken off the streets and into the hotel program which can lead them to a permanent place to live, health care and a job. We all know that there is more to be done but it is a start and the riverbed will be cleaner without people living down there.

We are glad to have Lt. Rowan here and appreciate his guidance in making Norco a safer place.

FEBRUARY SPEAKER DON WILLIAMSON

Our February speaker at our general membership meeting was Don Williamson on gun ownership. He gave us valuable information on buying and storing guns as well as how to be a responsible owner. You need to decide if you really want to own guns and if you do, be sure you know how to properly use them and the importance of training regularly so that you are familiar with handling that gun.

What type of gun is needed depends on usage. Why do you want a gun and what do you plan to use it for? For the guns you own, how often do you train or practice with that gun? If you don't remember how to load it because it has been 10 years since you shot it you will not find it of much use in a tough situation.

Don answered a lot of individual questions, such as can I shoot a dog that is attacking my horse? When can I use a gun to legally protect myself and my property? This was a very informative meeting for all that attended.





HORSEWEEK APRIL

After 2 years off, we are finally going to the 50th Horseweek this year. The dates are April 15 to 24. The first weekend will be the rodeo and parade. Sunday the 17th is Easter so the sunrise service is that morning. The Challenged Children's Rodeo will be on Saturday the 16th. The rest of the events are as usual.

NHA will be doing the Chili Night and the Obstacle course as always. We need help with both of these events so please call Darrell (562) 397-5080 to sign up. For Chili Night we need people to help serve the chili, keep the tables clean, serve the chili judges and help with the beer and wine. The obstacle course needs at least 20 people to man the obstacles. Again, young folks can help. They can reset obstacles and run messages etc. so please encourage them to help if possible. If you are signed up as a judge you will be invited that day to be part of that discussion.
