### OAK CREEK WILD MORGAN HORSE TRIP

Howdy NHA members! We will be going to visit the wild Morgan horses again on June 11<sup>th</sup>. We will be leaving Norco around 730 am on Saturday, 11 June and should arrive near the Oak Creek sight around 930 am.

The horses roam on a 6000-acre Portland Cement property, near Tehachapi with large Southern California Edison Wind farm machines all over the property. The horses normally come down to a large meadow area to eat alfalfa, which we all will be bringing. You will be able to see these majestic animals up close. These horses are suspected to be descendants of Morgan ranch horses from the 1800's.

If you are interested in going on the trip, we will have a sign up sheet at the next Monthly meeting, May 19<sup>th</sup>, 7pm at the American Legion Post 328 in Norco. Thank you to all of you that support this program. We are making a difference in our community.










### YARD SALE 2022
