Next is Horseweek. Ten days of events plus the Easter sunrise service on Easter, March 31st at 7 am. Ride to it if you can or just drive up to the service. If you sleep in but want to bring your horse, put it in the trailer and trailer it to the service. You can saddle there and there is plenty of room to park.

April 19 starts Horseweek with a weekend of ranch rodeo and bull riding or bull trying to ride. If you buy your tickets online, they are only \$18 for Friday and Sunday, \$20 for Saturday. Beware of the scammers trying to get you to pay over \$80 for a ticket. Warn others that there are several scams for this event. Go to the official Horseweek site to buy your tickets. They usually sell out, so I suggest you buy your tickets ahead of time to guarantee that you have a ticket. Parking is \$15 cash only so be sure and bring some cash for parking. NHA helps with Chili Night on Monday and the Obstacle Course on Thursday of that week. Darrell is looking for people to help with both events so join us if you can. Chili night finishes by about 8 or so, the obstacle course lasts later depending on how fast we can move people through the course and if we limit the number of entries. MEMBERSHIP MEETING SPEAKERS

The last two meetings we have had some interesting speakers. Very different topics but interesting to all of you living in Norco. In January our speaker was Henry Pyle of Chartwell Real Estate Development Company. They own the property on Parkridge that currently houses the QuickCrete plant. QuickCrete will be moving off the property and Chartwell is looking at how to use the property after that. They have looked at apartments and commercial uses and have decided that a manufacturing usage, which is the zoning, is most appropriate. In February, our mayor Kevin Bash was our speaker. He spoke about the RTP project as well as his plans for his year as mayor. As always, he has lots of ideas and it should be a busy year. I try to get a variety of speakers at our meetings and hope that each and every one of them will help you stay informed as a Norco resident.



PRESIDENTS MESSAGE (Cont. from page 2) It is time to renew your membership. Please do so. Some of you are very active and others not but we need the numbers to show how we represent the residents of Norco that want Norco to remain the rural animal and agriculture community that it is.

Also, encourage your neighbors to join NHA. There is a membership application included with this newsletter. The state housing laws are getting worse and worse. Your City council has spent many hours trying to figure out ways to keep Norco from being a land of apartments and other high density housing. But our state people think they know how we should live and not how we want to live. No longer does R-1 and A-1 mean that there can only be one dwelling unit on your property. Our waste hauling contract with Waste Management is up for renewal or secure a new contractor in July. The City has put out an RFP and is reviewing the applicants. If you have concerns, now is the time to voice them. Try to stay dry and ride your horse as much as you can. Please let me know if you have concerns and if NHA can support you as you support NHA.

RIVERSIDE TRANSMISSION RELIABILITY PROJECT

This project has been discussed for at least 10 years. The project would bring a second source of electricity to the city of Riverside. Norco receives no benefit from this project.

The transmission lines would go through Jurupa Valley, across the river into Norco by Viceroy Street and up Arlington into Riverside. Part of the project would be underground but the part in Norco and along Arlington would be above ground. The project will be built.

The concern in Norco is the look and fire danger from above ground lines. For all of us that ride in Hidden Valley, the view of big power lines is not attractive to say the least. But the fire danger to the whole city of Norco is huge. It is not just the people that live in that area but on a windy day it could be the entire city of Norco on fire. It has happened in other parts of the country.

The decision now rests with the CPUC, California Public Utilities Commission. They meet once a month in various areas of the state. During February they met in Orange County, so some residents were able to go to the meeting and speak for undergrounding the project. Many of us called in and voiced our concerns for overhead power lines. But our work is not done. During March the CPUC will be meeting again. This meeting will be in northern California so it is not likely that any of us will be able to attend. I will email everyone in NHA that we have an email address for about the meeting and how to call in. I am hoping we can get enough people to call in so that the comments last for hours.

I was on hold for 1 ½ hours before I was able to speak this last time so plan to call in to voice your concern and plan to be on hold for a while.



I know the notice was only an hour before the meeting in February, but I did not get much notice to pass it on.

This next time I should have more lead time to let you know so you can plan to participate. Edison does not want to lose this one to “Little Norco” so let’s show them we fight when we need to!
