This year they have proposed the following: Horseless Carriage Dr. (All), Hidden Trails Dr. (All), Smokewood Dr. (All), Top O The Walk Dr. (All), Temescal Ave. (Fifth to Sixth), Wrangler Way (All), Woodward Ave. (All), Corona Ave. (Fifth to River Dr.), First Street (Corona Ave. to Temescal Ave.), Second Street (Valley View to Corona). I have made a couple of extra suggestions that they will consider at the next STU meeting: Deputy Evens (All) and Crestview (North of Sixth St.). You can also attend this meeting and make recommendations.

If you see a trail issue let us know and we will work to fix it. If you are interested in helping just let me know. We meet monthly to review requests for fence and trail repair and to schedule work parties.


